"Thank you" makes you vulnerable to all sorts of other Ronnie Toon human emotions. It opens you up. It says you can't do it 28 October 2019 on your own. It connects you with others.

It's humbling, because it says you have needs — you have holes in your life and your character that need to be filled. You are not self-sufficient. "Thank you. You gave me something I did not have before."

"Thank you" puts you below or equal to, but certainly never higher than someone else. This is in keeping with those who are carriers of the message of Grace. Grace is never Grace turned downward. You never hand down grace. That's because grace, to be fully understood, comes to us when we are down. There is no one below you when you receive the grace of God, and since we receive the grace of God daily, there should never ever be anyone below us. There is no other place for grace to go except out and up.

Hopefully, you will have a Thanksgiving to remember, and find that God's grace is enough to cover all our sin and dysfunction. "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins" (1 Peter 4:8). That doesn't mean it buries our sins or acts as if they aren't there. All of us are sinners. We know that. What does "Thank you" say that makes such a We all let each other down. We all hurt each other. In our flesh, we are as devious as a raccoon. We smell like skunks and look like possums (have you ever seen anything uglier than a possum?). Grace allows us to overlook those things. We know God has covered our sin. It's the only way we can be truly thankful for each other. "Thank you" is a way of life.
